Labour Day march, picnic celebrate Winnipeg's labour movement

It was the first time in well over a decade that labour and political leaders, union activists, and workers marched around Winnipeg on Labour Day to celebrate the contributions of working people and the labour movement.

The march started at the Manitoba Legislature and ended at Vimy Ridge Park for the annual Labour Day family picnic. The picnic featured live entertainment, hot dogs and many activities for all to enjoy. "This is a very important event for the labour movement and our community," said Local 500 President, Mike Davidson. "It's a day to celebrate and recognize all of the things that the labour movement has fought for over the years that affect all workers, not just union workers."

Labour Day became a national holiday on July 23rd, 1894 and the concept of celebrating workers in Canada is just as relevant today. The first Labour Day parade in Winnipeg in 1894 was two miles long. CUPE Local 500 would like to thank our members from the City's Streets Maintenance and Traffic Services Division for once again, bringing out their equipment to the event.

"The chance for children to explore the city equipment is one of the biggest attractions at the picnic," said Davidson. "I was happy to see our members participate again this year."

It is estimated that close to 800 people were in attendance at this year's picnic.

On the bargaining front, we are busy preparing for negotiations with the City of Winnipeg, St. Boniface Museum, Kirkfield-Westwood Community Centre and Varsity View Community Centre.

We can also report that the Provincial Health Care Council agreed to participate in an Interest Arbitration process to rule on the outstanding bargaining issues. At the time of writing, the formal arbitration hearings were concluded and the parties are awaiting the arbitrator's decision.

The Local will continue to provide bargaining updates as more information becomes available.

Other priorities for our Local include participation in the city's 2015 operating budget debate. Our bargaining unit has faced many years of vacancy management and ongoing cuts to civic departments. The Local will be making presentations when necessary at city hall to defend the services our members provide on a daily basis.

New online Pension Estimator tool is now available!

The Winnipeg Civic Employees' Benefits Program (WCEBP) has developed an online pension estimator that will estimate your retirement pension using the information from your most recent Annual Statement of Benefits.

To use the estimator, you **must** be a member of The Winnipeg Civic Employees' Pension Plan and have service on or before Dec 31, 2013.
