





Waste Collection – Sept. 2016



- This city-wide survey was designed and conducted by Probe Research Inc. in partnership with CUPE Manitoba. Telephone interviews were conducted between Sept. 13 and Sept. 26, 2016 among a random and representative sampling of 600 Winnipeg adults.
- With a sample of 600 one can say with 95 percent certainty that the results are within +/- 4.0 percentage points of what they would have been if the entire adult population of Winnipeg had been interviewed. The margin-of-error is higher within each of the survey's population sub-groups.
- Modified random-digit dialing of both landline and wireless numbers was used to ensure that all Winnipeg adults would have an equal opportunity to participate in this Probe Research survey.
- Minor statistical weighting by age, gender and other demographic characteristics has been applied to this sample to ensure that it corresponds with the city as a whole.



PRDBE PUblic Opinion on Investigating In-House Waste Collection Services


