The following is my monthly report of the activities and issues facing the Local since our last Central Council meeting:

HEALTH CARE REPRESENTATION VOTES – UPDATE

On June 13, the Commissioner responsible for the implementation of the Health Sector Bargaining Unit Review Act (HSBURA) announced the dates for the union representation votes as August 8 to August 22.

All affected employees will be receiving a letter from the Commissioner by mail prior to July 10 explaining the votes. Between July 11 and August 7, voters will be receiving a Personal Identification Number (PIN) in the mail. A help desk will also be available to employees who may have questions. Voting will take place starting at 12:00 noon on August 8 and will end at 12:00 noon on August 22. Voting will be available 24 hours a day, online or by phone in English and French. Once voting concludes the results will be tabulated and released.

CUPE wants all members to know that while these votes are taking place, CUPE will continue to prioritize fighting for you in the workplace. We know health care workers are going through a difficult time, and we're committed to being with you, for you at work.

The Local will update the membership as more information becomes available.
