## WINNIPEG CIVIC ELECTION

Winnipeg held its Civic Elections for mayor, councillors and school trustees on October 22<sup>-</sup> Although we did not end up with all the results we were looking for, we did see Shawn Dobson, Cindy Gilroy, Matt Allard and Jason Schreyer as newly elected councillors. We look forward to working with them and wish them all the best in their term in office.

As well, re-elected were: Councillors Gerbasi, Orlikow, Eadie, Mayes, Wyatt Browaty, Pagtakhan and Sharma. Also elected were Councillors Scott Gillingham, Janice Lukes, Marty Morantz and Brian Bowman for Mayor.

We have many challenges ahead of us and the Local remains committed to work with City Council in order to provide the very best front line services to the citizens of Winnipeg.

## LOCAL 500 RADIO AD

The Local aired a new radio ad urging voters to ask their mayoral and councillor candidates about their plans to deliver and defend public services.

Over the past decade Winnipeggers have experienced a political mind-set determined to sell off city assets and privatize public services. We know that privatization, means higher costs, service cuts and no accountability. Reliable public services delivered by dedicated public employees are one of the reasons why Winnipeg works.

The radio ad began airing on September 22 and continued up to the election date on October 22<sup>nd</sup>.

# HEALTH CARE SUPPORT WORKERS' WEEK

CUPE Local 500 members working Riverview Health Centre and the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority recently celebrated Health Care Support Workers' Week. This year, the Government of Manitoba proclaimed the week of October 13 - 17 as "Healthcare Support Workers' Week" to acknowledge their contribution and dedication to the health of Manitobans.

Health care support workers are important and essential to our health care system. I'm pleased to see that their contributions and commitment to patient care are being recognized, and I commend our members for their dedicated efforts day in and day out.

Kirkfield-Westwood Community Centre and Varsity View Community Centre have also sent notification to the employer requesting to commence bargaining.

St. Boniface Museum is also preparing to commence the bargaining process with its employer.

On October 24, Local 500 staff and I met with our members at River View Health Care Centre to provide an update on Health Care Bargaining.

The Local will be very busy in connection to bargaining a number of collective agreements this year! Thank you to all committee members and good luck in achieving a fair collective agreement for everyone.

## LES BUTTERWORTH SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

The Les Butterworth Scholarship Fund awards dinner was held this past month at the RBC Winnipeg Convention Centre. This event is in memory of Brother Les Butterworth for his dedication to his Union and his selfless concern for the welfare of others. The fund helps union members and their families defray the cost of higher education.

This year, one scholarship of \$1,250 and three bursaries of \$750 were awarded.
